Regarding Student use of rough/scratch paper on exams, here is the change from the Invigilator's Handbook: *Handbook of procedures for the Diploma Programme 2012* 

12.2 Ensure that all candidates have the correct coversheet and sufficient stationery, such as answer sheets (if required), pencils and/or graph paper. If a candidate wishes to write a draft for an answer, or any part of an answer, the draft must be written on IB answer paper. If the candidate does not want this draft to be marked, a line must be drawn through that draft or the working out of an answer. In examinations where the answers are written on the examination paper itself (referred to as a structured examination paper) the draft/working out can be written on remaining blank pages of the examination paper or on IB answer paper subsequently attached to the examination paper. Again, if the candidate does not want this to be marked, a line must be drawn through this work. In both situations the candidate's draft work must be submitted and not retained either by the school or by the candidate.

You are not supposed to use IB answer paper in classrooms for practice.

You are now supposed to keep exam stationary secured along with exams.

Where do you hold your exams?

Most hold exams in their schools, nearby churches, or community colleges.

Most pay fees for locations separate from the school.
